

The Battery

The phone comes with a rechargeable battery. The battery charge level is shown at the top of the LCD screen.

Installing the Battery





The available scientific evidence does not show that any hours problems are associated with using wireless phones. Where is no proof, however, the wireless phones are absolutely safe. Wireless phone emit low levels of radiofrequency energy (RF) in the microwave range while being used. They also emit very low level of RF when in the Home can produce health effects (by heating tissue). streen. Whereas high levels of RF heating tissue), exposure to low level RF that does not produce heating effects causes no known adverse health effects. Many studies of low level RF exposures have not found any biological effects. Some studies have suggested that some biological effects may occur, but such findings have not been confirmed by additional research. In some cases, other researchers have had difficulty in reproducing those studies, or in determining the

reasons for inconsistent results.

2. What is the FDA's role concerning the safety of wireless phones?

Under the law, the FDA does not review the safety of radiationemitting consumer devices. However, the agency has authority to take action if wireless phones. products such as wireless phones wireless phones are shown to emit radiofrequency energy(RF) at a level that is hazardous to the user. In such a case, # FDA could require the mufacturers of wireless phones to notify users of the malth hazard and to repair, replace, or recall the phones that the hazard no long exists. Although the examg scientific data do not stify FDA regulatory actions, the FDA has urged the wireless

phone industry to take a number of steps, including the Mowing:

The FDA belongs to an interagency working group of the federal agencies that have responsibility for different aspects of RF safety to ensure coordinated efforts at the federal level. The following

The National lastitutes of Health participates some interagency working group activities, as well.

The FM shares regulatory responsibilities for wireless phones with the Federal

Communications Commission (FCC). All phones that are self in the United States must simply with FCC safety guidelites that limit RF exposure. The FCC relies on the FDA and other health agencies for safety questions about wireless phones.

The FCC also regulates the base stations that the wireless phone networks rely upon. While these lose stations operate at higher power than do the wireless phones themselves, the RF exposures that people get from these base stations are typically thousands of times lower than those they can get from wireless phones. Base stations are thus not the subject of the safety questions discussed in this document.

3. What kinds of phones are the subject of this update?

The term 'wireless phone' refers

here to handheld wireless phones with built-in antennas, often called 'cell', 'mobile', or 'PCS' phones. These types of wireless phones can expose the user to measurable radiofrequency energy (RF) because of the short distance between the phone and the user's head. These RF exposures are limited by FCC safety guidelines that were developed with the advice of the FDA and other federal health and safety agencies. When the phone is located at greater distances from the user, the exposere to RF is drastically lower because a person's RF exposite decreases rapidly with increasing distance from the so. The so-called 'cordless phones,' which have a base we connected to the telegoone wiring in a house, typically operate at far lower ower levels, and thus produce RF exposures far below the FCC safety limits.

4. What are the results of the research done already?

The research done ous far has produced conflicting results, and many studies we suffered from flaws in their research methods. Animal experiments investigating the effects of radiofrequency energy (RF) exposures Raracteristic of wireless phones Chave yielded conflicting results that often cannot be repeated in other laboratories. A few animal studies, however, have suggested that low levels of RF could accelerate the development of cancer in laboratory animals. However, many of the studies that showed increased tumor development used animals that had been genetically engineered or treated with cancer causing chemicals so as to be predisposed to develop cancer in the absence of RF exposure. Other studies exposed the

animals to RF for up to 22 hours per day. These conditions are not similar to the conditions under which people use wireless phones, so we don't know with certainty what the results of such studies mean for human health. Three large epidemiology studies have been published since December 2000. Between them. the studies investigated any possible association between the use of wireless phones and primary brain cancer, glioma, meningioma, or acoustic neuroma, tumors of the brain salivary gland, leukemia, other cancers. None of the studies demonstrated the existence of any harmful healt Affects from wireless phone RF exposures. However, now of the studies can answer questions about long-term exposures, since the average period of phone use in the studies was around three

5. What research is needed to decide whether RF existing from wireless. from wireless phones poses a health risk?

Acombination of laboratory studies and coldemiological studies of beople actually using wireless phones would provide studies could be completed in a few years. However, very land ngeded. Lifetime animal exposure needed to provide reliable proof of a cancer promoting effect if one exists. Epidemiological studies can provide data that is directly applicable to human populations, but 10 or more years follow-up may be needed to provide answers about some health effects, such as cancer. This is because the interval between the time of exposure to

a cancercausing agent and the time tumors develop - if they domay be many, many years. The interpretation of epidemiological studies is hampered by difficulties in measuring actual RF exposure during day-to-day use of wireless phones. Many factors

The FDA provides the scientific oversight, obtaining input from experts in government, industry, and academic organizations. CTIAfunded research is conducted through contracts with

independent investigators. The initial research will include both laboratory studies and studies of wireless phone users. The CRADA will also include a broad assessment of additional research needs in the context of the latest research developments around the world.

7. How can I find out how much radio frequency energy exposure I can get by using my wireless phone?

All phones sold in the United States must comply with Fedgral Communications Commission (FCC) guidelines that light radio frequency energy (RF) exposures. The FCC established these guidelines in consultation with the FDA and the other federal head and safety agencies. The FCC limit for RF exposure from wireless the phones is set at a Specific Absorption Rate (SAR) of 1.6

watts per kilogram (1.6 W/kg). The FCC limit is consist the safety standards developed by the Institute of Electrical and Electronic Engineering (IEEE) and the National Council on Radiation Protection and Measurement The exposure limit takes into Consideration the body's bility to remove heat from the tissues that absorb and also one of the wireless pand is set well below levels known to have effects. exergy from the wireless phone Manufacturers of wireless phones must report the RF exposure level for each model of phone to the FCC. 8. What has the FDA done to measure the radio frequency

energy coming from wireless phones?

The Institute of Electrical and Electronic Engineers (IEEE) is developing a technical standard for measuring the radio frequency energy (RF) exposure from wireless phones and other wireless handsets with the participation and leadership of FDA scientists and engineers. The standard, 'Recommended Practice for Determining the Spatial- Peak Specific Absorption Rate (SAR) in the Human Pody Due to Wireless Communications Devices: Experiments Techniques,' sets orth the first consistent test methodology for measuring the rate at which RF is deposited in the heads of wireles phone users. The test metod uses a tissuesimulating odel of the human head. Standardized SAR test methodology is expected to

greatly improve the consistency of measurements made of different laboratories on the same phone. SAR to the measurement of the amount of energy absorbed in tissue, either by the whole body or a small part of the body. It is measured in wats/kg (or milliwatts/g) of notice. This measurement is used to determine whether a wireless phone complies with safety guidelines.

9. What steps can I take to reduce my exposure to radiofrequency energy from my wireless phone?

If there is a risk from these products - and at this point we do not know that there is - it is probably very small. But if you are concerned about avoiding even potential risks, you can take a few simple steps to minimize your exposure to radiofrequency energy (RF). Since time is a key

factor in how much exposure a person receives, reducing the amount of time spent using a wireless phone will reduce RF exposure. If you must conduct extended conversations by wireless phone every day, you could place more distance between your body and the source of the RF, since the exposure level drops off phone away from your body ouse a wireless phone cope. to a remote antenna. Again a scientific data do not demonstrate that wireless phones are harmfun But if you are concerned about the RF exposure from these products, you can use measures like those described above to reduce your RF exposure from wireless phone

10. What about children using wireless phones?

The scientific evidence gas not show a danger to use sof wireless phones. children and teen gers. If you want to take **ste**ps to lower exposure to adiofrequency energy (NF), the measures described above would apply to children and teenagers using increasing the distance between groups sponsored by other national governments have advised that children be discouraged from using wireless phones at all. For example, the government in the United Kingdom distributed leaflets containing such a recommendation in December 2000. They noted that no

evidence exists that using a wireless phone causes brain tumors or other ill effects. Their recommendation to limit wireless phone use by children was strictly precautionary; it was not based on scientific evidence that any health hazard exists.

11. What about wireless phone interference with medical equipment?

ŏ Radio frequency energy (RF) from wireless phones can intend with some electronic devices. For this reason, the FDA helped develop a detailed text method to measure electromagnetic interference (EMI) of implanted cardiac pacemakers and defibrillators from wireless telephores. This test method is now art of a standard spensored by the Association for the Advancement of Medical instrumentation (AAMI). The final draft, a joint effort by the

FDA. medical device manufacturers, and max groups, was completed in late 2000. This standad will allow manufacturers ensure that cardiac pacemakers and defibrillaters are safe from wireless hone EMI. The FDA has tested hearing aids for cerference from handheld wireless phones and helped develop a voluntary standard sponsored by the Institute of Electrical and Electronic Engineers (IEEE). This standard specifies test methods and performance requirements for hearing aids and wireless phones so that no interference occurs when a person uses a 'compatible' phone and a 'compatible' hearing aid at the same time. This standard was approved by the IEEE in 2000. The FDA continues to monitor the use of wireless phones for

possible interactions with other medical devices. Should harmful interference be found to occur, the FDA will conduct testing to assess the interference and work to resolve the problem.
