Section 1 - Emulation



- Windows emulation software allows you to run windows games (and other applications) under other operating systems.
- Wine is probably the most popular emulator for Ubuntu (Scott Richie ran a session on this on Tuesday – see the session log for more information).
 - PlayOnLinux is a graphical front-end for Wine which makes using Wine more quick and easy.


Section 2 – FOSS Games

- FOSS Stands for "Free and Open Source Software", which means that said software (and its source code) are free to download and modify.
