RE: <u>PUBLIC COMMENT BY THE LGBT EQUALITY CAUCUS OF THE GENERAL</u> <u>ASSEMBLY ON THE GUIDANCE CONCERNING PROTECTIONS FOR LESBIAN, GAY,</u> <u>BISEXUAL AND TRANSGENDER INDIVIDUALS IN THE PENNSYLVANIA HUMAN</u> <u>RELATIONS ACT AND GUIDANCE CONCERNING PROTECTIONS FOR LESBIAN, GAY,</u> <u>BISEXUAL, TRANSGENDER AND QUEER/QUESTIONING INDIVIDUALS IN THE FAIR</u> <u>EDUCATIONAL OPPORTUNITIES ACT</u>

On behalf of the members of the LGBT Equality Caucus of the Pennsylvania General Assembly, please accept our public comment and support for the *Guidance Concerning Protections for* Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual and Transgender Individuals in the Pennsylvania Human Relations Act and Guidance Concerning Protections for Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, Transgender and Queer/Questioning Individuals in the Fair Educational Opportunities Act ("Guidance").

This Guidance addresses a significant and conspicuous omission in Pennsylvania discrimination law, namely the failure of our statutes to protect Pennsylvania residents explicitly from discrimination in employment, housing, public accommodation and education based on sexual orientation, gender identity or expression.

Currently, the Pennsylvania Human Relations Act ("PHRA") and the Fair Educational Opportunities Act ("FEOA") appear on their face to exclude sexual orientation, gender identity and expression from the list of protected categories. Compelled by this omission, forty four municipalities across the Commonwealth have affirmatively added sexual orientation, and gender identity and expression to the list of protected categories to local anti-discrimination ordinances. However, heretofore, the Pennsylvania Human Relations Commission, the only state_agency able to provide relief from discrimination for members of the LGBT community, has been stymied in its effort because the General Assembly has stubbornly refused to recognize the fundamental right of our LGBT neighbors and children to be free from discrimination.

In <u>Price Waterhouse v. Hopkins</u>, 490 U.S. 228 (1989), the United States Supreme Court held that discrimination against an employee on the basis of sex stereotyping--that is, a person's nonconformity to social or other expectations of that person's gender--constitutes impermissible sex discrimination. This long standing precedent is now recognized, in limited circumstances, as providing a cause of action to individuals who have experienced discrimination because of their

sexual orientation, gender identity or expression. The Pennsylvania Human Relations Commission now intends to use this established precedent to protect LGBT Pennsylvanians from discrimination. It is the right move at the right time.

But let us be clear: Unless and until the legislature acts and the Fairness Act is passed, LGBT individuals will not be unequivocally and expressly protected from discrimination in employment, housing, public accommodation and education. LGBT Pennsylvanians will continue to face uncertainty in seeking relief from discrimination.

Thank you for your continued efforts to ensure that all Pennsylvanians can enjoy freedom from discrimination in employment, housing, public accommodation and education. The LGBT Equality Caucus strongly supports the proposed PHRC Guidance Concerning Protections for Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual and Transgender Individuals in the Pennsylvania Human Relations Act and the Guidance Concerning Protections for Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, Transgender and Queer/Questioning Individuals in the Fair Educational Opportunities Act. It is our fervent hope to soon amend the Pennsylvania Human Relations Act and the Fair Education Opportunities Act to unequivocally protect Pennsylvanians from discrimination because of sexual orientation, gender identity or expression.
